MHT-CET-2017

The Common Entrance Test for admission to Engineering and Pharmacy 1st year Degree Courses, MHT-CET-2017 was conducted on Thursday, 11th May, 2017 by Competent Authority & Commissioner, State CET Cell, Mumbai appointed by Government of Maharashtra. The provisional result of the same is being declared on 04th June 2017.

The subject experts have opined that four (04) questions in the question papers of the aforesaid examination are defective. The Competent Authority, on the basis of the opinion and advice of the respective subject expert has taken a decision to make these four (04) questions "non-evaluative / invalid". Out of these four questions three questions carry one mark each for a correct answer and one question carries two marks for a correct answer. Therefore, instead of reducing the maximum number of marks from 200 to 195, the Competent Authority has decided to allot marks for each these defective MCQ to all candidates who appeared in this examination, thus keeping maximum marks as 200; unchanged. The details of "Non-evaluative/ Invalid" MCQ are shown in the **Table No. - 1** at respective Sr. No. in each version.

It is expressly clarified that all other "Model-Answers" of questions provided by all the subject experts and the answers provided by the Original setters/Moderators appointed by this Competent Authority have fully matched with each other and hence taken as correct and "evaluative". Except that the answer key for the chemistry subject question number 92 in version 11 is **D** instead of **A**.

It is further clarified that the aforesaid four (04) questions have been made non-evaluative and hence if the candidate opts for verification, the answer to these questions will appear as * in the printout of the key response.
